Legislation Editorial

A MORE AMERICAN CONSERVATISM Larry P. Arnn, President, Hillsdale College, Hillsdale, MI.

The astonishing political campaign of 2016 involved much debate about whether Donald J. Trump is a conservative. He pointed out once that he was seeking the nomination of the Republican not the Conservative party. Yet there is a lot we can learn from him about conservatism.

What makes them conservative? It is the additional knowledge that things that have a good reputation for a long time are more trustworthy than new things. This is especially true of original things. The very term *principle* refers to something that comes first.

If American Conservatism means anything, then it means the things found at the beginning of America when it became a nation. This means in turn that the Declaration of Independence where the final causes of our nation are stated, and the Constitution of the United States, where the form of government is established, are the original things. It follows then that if Donald Trump helps to conserve these things, he is conservative in the sense that matters most to the republic of the Americans.

Today, however, the government has grown so large that it is a major factor in everything. Trump has addressed this problem more directly than anyone since Ronald Reagan. He has rallied the people in direct opposition to their governing elite. He has appealed to the people directly in opposition to their government.

Moreover, Trump ran in utter defiance of the political correctness that enforces its new system of government. He did not bend his knee to identity groups. He claimed to represent the citizens. He means citizens who hold that status under the law. Trump is possessed of moral courage as much as assertiveness.

I prefer to be hopeful about the future and I am hopeful about the Trump administration. His campaign and his appointments at this early stage give us some information upon which to speculate. But I would be hopeful for many reasons. One of the main ones is that he wrote this on January 16, 2016:

"The United State of America is a land of laws, and Americans value the rule of law above all. Why then has our Congress allowed the President and the executive branch to take on near dictatorial powers?... What is needed in Washington is a president who will rein in the executive branch and work with congress to make sure the legislative branch does its job.

Americanism

What a year it was! After all the mayhem during the election, America's new President-Elect Donald J. Trump was the winner. Some liberals were left scratching their heads, some holding cry-ins in their offices...I am reminded of President-Elect Trump as I re-read this portion of Ronald Reagan's speech..."a time for choosing". We can let the liberal media, a lame duck President...tell us that America is and has been or we can band together and help MAKE AMERICA GREAT AGAIN. Happy New Year. Please enjoy an excerpt from President Ronald Reagan's speech...Susan Patena, Americanism Chair

"Not too long ago, two friends of mine were talking to a Cuban refugee, a businessman who had escaped from Castro, and in the midst of his story one of my friends turned to the other and said, "We don't know how lucky we are." And the Cuban stopped and said, "How lucky you are? I had someplace to escape to." And in that sentence he told us the entire story. If we lose freedom here, there's no place to escape to. This is the last stand on earth And this idea that government is beholden to the people, that it has no other source of power except the sovereign people, is still the newest and the most unique idea in all the long history of man's relation to man.

This is the issue of this election: whether we believe in our capacity for self-government or whether we abandon the American revolution and confess that a little intellectual elite in a far-distant capitol can plan our lives for us better than we can plan them ourselves.

You and I are told increasingly we have to choose between a left or right. Well I'd like to suggest there is no such thing as a left or right. There's only an up or down: [up] man's old -- old-aged dream, the ultimate in individual freedom consistent with law and order, or down to the ant heap of totalitarianism. And regardless of their sincerity, their humanitarian motives, those who would trade our freedom for security have embarked on this downward course

In this vote-harvesting time, they use terms like the "Great Society," or as we were told a few days ago by the President, we must accept a greater government activity in the affairs of the people. But they've been a little more explicit in the past and among themselves; and all of the things I now will quote have appeared in print. These are not Republican accusations. For example, they have voices that say, "The cold war will end through our acceptance of a not undemocratic socialism." Another voice says, "The profit motive has become outmoded. It must be replaced by the incentives of the welfare state." Or, "Our traditional system of individual freedom is incapable of solving the complex problems of the 20th century." Senator Fulbright has said at Stanford University that the Constitution is outmoded. He referred to the President as "our moral teacher and our leader," and he says he is "hobbled in his task by the restrictions of power imposed on him by this antiquated document." He must "be freed," so that he "can do for us" what he knows "is best." And Senator Clark of Pennsylvania, another articulate spokesman, defines liberalism as "meeting the material needs of the masses through the full power of centralized government.

Well, I for one, resent it when a representative of the people refers to you and me, the free women of this country as "the masses." This is a term we haven't applied to ourselves in America. But beyond that, "the full power of centralized government"- this was the very thing the founding Fathers sought to minimize. They knew that governments don't control things. A government can't control without controlling people. And they know when a government sets out to do that, it must use force and coercion to achieve its purpose. They also knew, those Founding Fathers, that outside of its legitimate functions, government does nothing as well as or as economically as the private sector of the economy...You and I have the courage to say to our enemies, "There is a price we will not pay." There is a point beyond which they must not advance." And this – this is the meaning in the phrase of Barry Goldwater's "peace through strength." Winston Churchill said," The destiny of man is not measured by material computations. When great forces are on the move in the world, we learn we're spirits- not animals And he said "There's

something going on in time and space, and beyond time and space, which we like it or not, spells duty...You and I have a rendezvous with destiny. We'll preserve for our children this, the best hope of man on earth, or we'll sentence them to the last step into a thousand years of darkness. We will keep in mind and remember that Barry Goldwater has faith in us. He has faith that you and I have the ability and dignity and the right to make decisions and determine our own destiny. Thank you very much. President Ronald Reagan, October 1964

The following excerpt is from a speech delivered by Russian dissident **Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn** to the AFL-CIO on June 30, 1975 as "A Warning to the Western World" aimed especially at the United States of America:

"I would like to call upon America to be more careful with its trust and prevent those wise persons who are attempting to establish even finer degrees of justice and even finer legal shades of equality – some because of their distorted outlook, others of short-sightedness and still others out of self interest – from falsely using the struggle for peace and for social justice to lead you down a false road. Because they are trying to weaken you, they are trying to disarm your strong and magnificent country never been seen before in the history of the world."
