

Hillsdale College: The Inspiring History of America and American Citizenship and Its Decline

Hillsdale College is a private conservative liberal arts college in Hillsdale, Michigan. Founded in 1844 by abolitionists known as Free Will Baptists, it has a liberal arts curriculum that is based on the Western heritage as a product of both the Greco-Roman culture and the Judeo-Christian tradition Hillsdale requires every student, regardless of concentration of studies, to complete a core curriculum that includes courses on the Great Books, the U.S. Constitution, biology, chemistry, and physics.

Since the late 20th century, in order to opt out of federal affirmative action policies, Hillsdale has been among a small number of U.S. colleges to decline governmental financial support, instead depending entirely on private funding.

Americans have overcome many challenges throughout our history, including the American Revolution, the Civil War, the Great Depression, two World Wars, and the Cold War. Studying the great stories from our past inspires us to preserve the blessings of liberty in our day.

Hillsdale College is offering free online courses. “The Great American Story: A Land of Hope,” will explore the history of America as a land of hope founded on high principles. In presenting the great triumphs and achievements of our nation’s past, as well as the shortcomings and failures, it offers a broad and unbiased study of the kind essential to the cultivation of intelligent patriotism. This approach runs contrary to the prevailing academic view of America as irredeemably racist, sexist, and unjust—a view advanced recently by *The New York Times’* 1619 Project. A proper study of American history proves that these claims are patently false, while providing timeless lessons about human nature that are essential to the preservation of self-government.

“American Citizenship and It’s Decline”. For most of American history, the people, understood as citizens, have ruled through elected representatives under the terms of the Constitution. Today, the constitutional rule of citizens is threatened by a new form of government, unaccountable to the people, in which power is held by a ruling class that seeks to transform our society. This course, based on Victor Davis Hanson’s book *The Dying Citizen*, examines the origins and history of citizenship in the West and the grave challenges to American citizenship today.

Opinion Page

“Hello, my name is Christopher Rake, MD, MPH. I'm a physician, a follower of Jesus, and a patriot who lost his job because I stood up for freedom.

You may have seen the now viral video of me being escorted out of UCLA for not taking the Covid injection:

I took the stand I did because I see our country going in a direction that is very dangerous. Both of my grandfathers bravely fought in World War II to conquer the kind of totalitarianism we are seeing here on our shores. After inheriting such a legacy of freedom from my grandfathers (and many others) I couldn't--for the sake of my temporary comfort--put my job above my liberties; I couldn't put my comfort above my freedom. I couldn't leave my children penniless when it comes to the bank of Liberty. What kind of man would I be, what kind of father would I be, if I did that?

Some ask why I didn't just take the religious exemption. After all, I could still be working if I had done that. There are a few reasons for this. First, I believe that this is a human rights issue which goes beyond religion. Atheists have just as much right to their bodies as religious people do. Furthermore, as a Christian, I know Jesus would have stood to protect *all* humanity, not just one religious group. In fact, the Bible says that "For God so loved the *world*, that He gave His only begotten Son," not "For God so loved the *Christians* that He gave..." (John 3:16). And, so--to stand in unity with every human being--I decided not to avail myself of that out. Instead, I stand with *everyone* who desires to avoid this injection, whether religious or not.

Second, in my opinion, to apply for an exemption is to ask permission of another entity in regards to your body. That is, filing an exemption, in my opinion, is implicitly agreeing with the totalitarian lie that another entity has some sort of ownership in your body. On the contrary, if a bully comes to assault you, you don't ask to be exempt from his assault. Instead, you stand up and tell him--in a loud and affirmative voice--"No!"

As a physician, one of the things that concerns me most about this discussion surrounding vaccine mandates is the complete violation of medical ethics. One of the pillars of medical ethics is Patient Autonomy. This inviolable pillar states that each person has the right to make his or her own medical decisions. Period. Plain and simple. A doctor has no right to force his will on his patients. Neither does your employer. Or your government. Period.

So, I stand on all those grounds. We are pursuing a legal fight against the vaccine mandates and it may go all the way to the Supreme Court. We need to establish that medical freedom is a fundamental right, protected by the Constitution. We need to restore ethics to the practice of medicine.”

We use the term “Covid injections” because, per the CDC’s original definition of vaccine (pre-September-2021), a vaccine confers immunity against disease. As per the CDC’s current admission, the Covid injections do not prevent infection nor the transmission of Covid-19. Thus, they are merely injections, not vaccines.

Op-Ed by NFRW President Ann Schockett
“Nine seems to be a good number.”

So said the late Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsberg in an NPR interview in 2019 regarding speculation about expanding the number of justices on the Supreme Court, also known as court-packing. Many Americans are surprised to learn the number of justices serving on the Supreme Court of the United States is not fixed in the Constitution. America has had nine justices on the Supreme Court since 1869, and most would say it's worked well in maintaining the checks and balances in our government. So why would anyone want to change that? The answer is simple – blatant partisan politics. There are politicians who want to use the Supreme Court to green-light policies initiated by the President through the back door of our court system when they can't get them passed in the legislature. Expanding the number of justices, they feel, would aid in that process.

Court-packing is not a new concept. President Franklin Delano Roosevelt tried to expand the number of Supreme Court Justices in an attempt to push through more of his New Deal policies. Even members of Roosevelt's own party thought this scheme would undermine the independence of our judiciary and pose a threat to the separation of powers among our three branches of government. He abandoned the idea. Why fix what isn't broken in the first place?

Liberal politicians and left-wing advocacy groups, however, ... Frustrated by the ideological balance of the current Supreme Court - particularly with confirmation of President Trump's nominees Justices Neil Gorsuch, Brett Kavanaugh, and Amy Coney Barrett – these activists are demanding that “the Supreme Court needs to be fixed and balance restored.”

Fortunately a bipartisan group composed of members of Congress, senators, and state attorneys general has emerged to set nine as the number of justices on the Supreme Court through an amendment to our Constitution. The “Keep Nine” amendment states simply: “The Supreme Court of the United States shall be composed of nine Justices.” This amendment to the Constitution was introduced in the House of Representatives by Rep. Dusty Johnson (R-SD) as H.J.Res. 11. Over 60 members have signed on as supporters. Senator Ted Cruz (R-TX) recently introduced a companion proposal, S.J.Res. 9, which he described as “preserving the integrity and independence of the Court, and protecting Americans' constitutional liberties.”

Now more than ever we as Americans need to preserve the independent nature of the Supreme Court. Court-packing completely undermines the separation of powers as written in the U.S. Constitution. A recent poll showed that 62% of American voters would favor a constitutional amendment to keep our Supreme Court at nine justices. I urge our NFRWarriors to get behind this important constitutional amendment. To help this gain traction, I recommend the following action items:

Ask your U.S. senators to support S.J.Res. 9. Ask your U.S. representative to sign onto H.J.Res. 11. If your senators and/or representatives have already signed onto these resolutions, contact them and thank them for their support in upholding this important part of our Constitution.

Ask your governor to issue a statement of support for the Keep Nine Amendment.

When contacting your elected officials, ask them to issue a statement publicly supporting the Keep Nine Amendment. Stay informed ...by going online to www.keepnine.org.
